Good morning friends,

The Garden Party has Begun!

Spinach, asparagus, rhubarb, radishes, and lettuce are plentiful from our gardens. All are available at the store, by order, and at any of the farmers' markets.

We have been planting seeds and transplanting our greenhouse plants almost every day for two weeks. Tomatoes are thus far our most advanced crop. With about 400 plants in the ground, many are over two feet tall and very strong.

Following the tomatoes are peppers; mild, sweet, hot, and extra hot. Strawberries will be starting soon but we lost our big patch to a confused landlord. It will take another year to get our own production into full swing. Seeds of every kind are now in the ground.

Our oldest son Mitch has returned back to the farm life after several years pursuing other interests. He arrived just in the nick of time for planting season. Mitch is helping with supervision of the farm. He's closer and more available to his daughter, "Desi" who lives in Watertown. We are very pleased with his return, as is our gardener. :-)

Well, the other day I was traveling through a pasture. In the valley just off the road before our camp grounds I saw a mother kildeer. She appeared to have a broken wing and was partially disabled.

As I was examining the situation, a little flicker on the ground caught my attention. It was

a baby Kildeer. Its legs were about an inch tall and its body was no bigger. It turned out that "Mom" was not injured but rather acting as easy prey to draw me (a predator in her eyes) away from her baby.
